

Twelve years ago this month, I was hired as the librarian with the first task being to move the library from its corner in City Hall to the 1100 square foot building next door. I was told at that time, it would be the last move, since the library had been in three previous locations. An explosion of growth and usage happened and the next thing you know, in September 2018 we moved to our current location. When we moved, we appreciated the extra space, but we knew we would have to add on or build new to accommodate the needs of a growing community. (This is becoming more of a necessity with each month.)

Staff is better trained than in any time during the library's 38 year history. I am a level 3 state certified librarian, and Tori has completed all the courses needed for level 1. (We are just waiting on the certificate to arrive.) CEU's are required each year to maintain that certification. I am also active in the state library association, and the national organization specifically for small libraries.

Who thinks the growth within the library just happened, with no planning, or thought behind it? My day doesn't end when the doors are locked. There are always new programs being planned, new books to consider purchasing, what are good projects for the teens, or how to make STEAM fun and exciting. Or what things would entice adults to participate?


There are so many things I would love to do within these walls, but there is not enough space. I would also love to be open on Mondays, but that requires more staffing, which means more funds. The list goes on...

A few weeks ago, I spoke to the excise board about funding from the county. I told them we had a 5A school, and we needed a 5A library. The services provided have untold monetary value. A library is ESSENTIAL to any community that wants literate, well-adjusted citizens.
